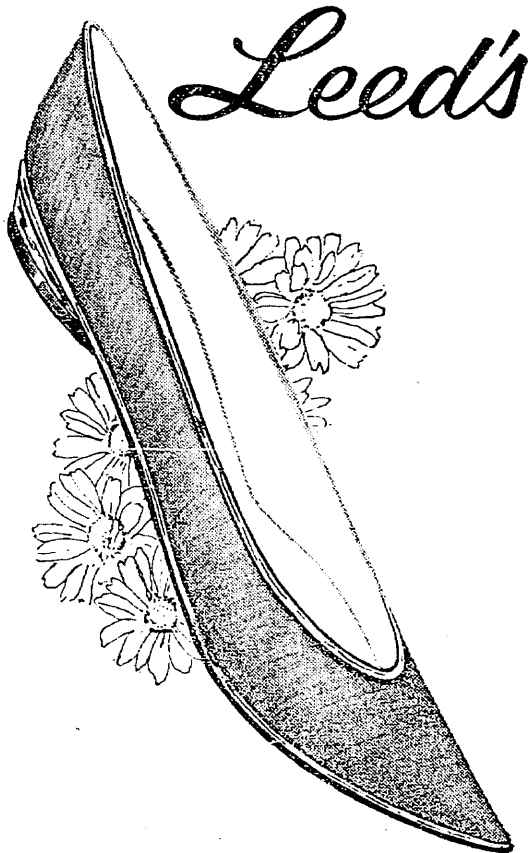
### Tacoma Resident Plans Many Summer Visits to Fairgrounds



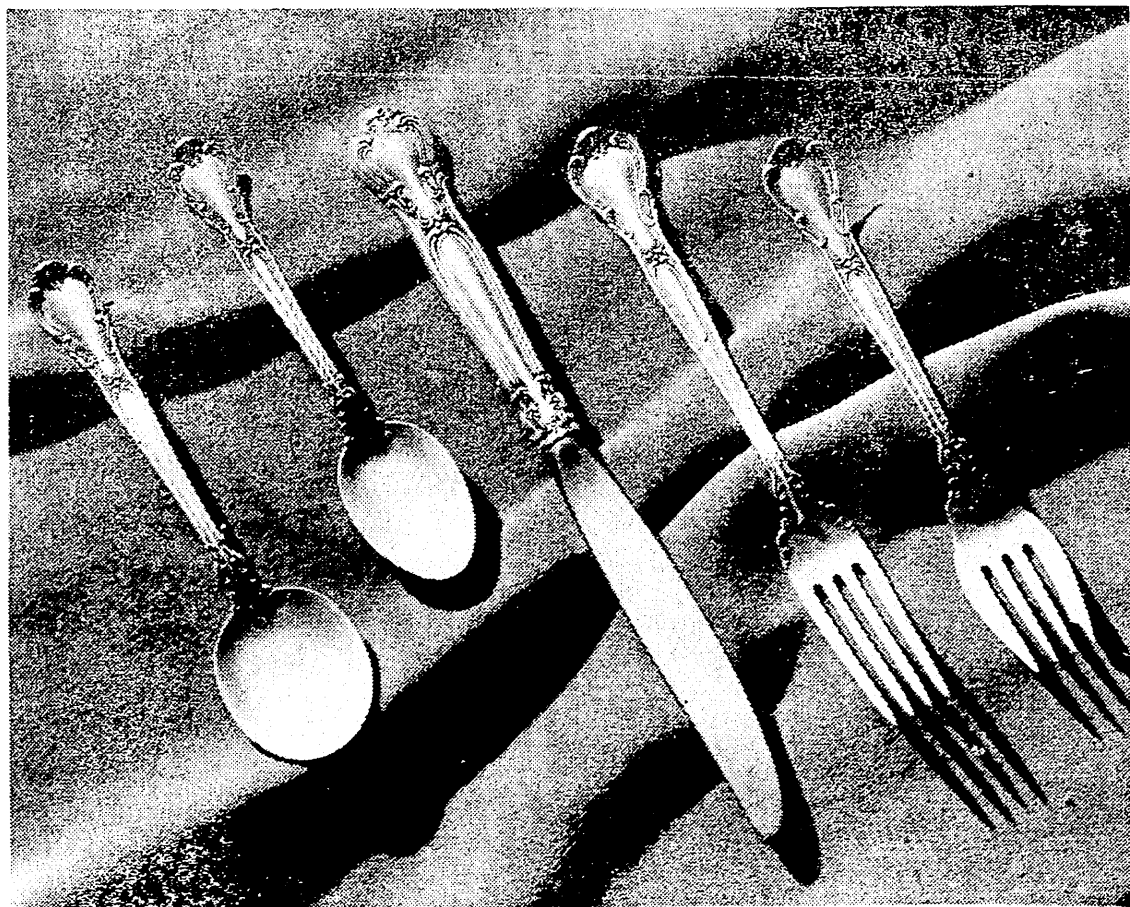

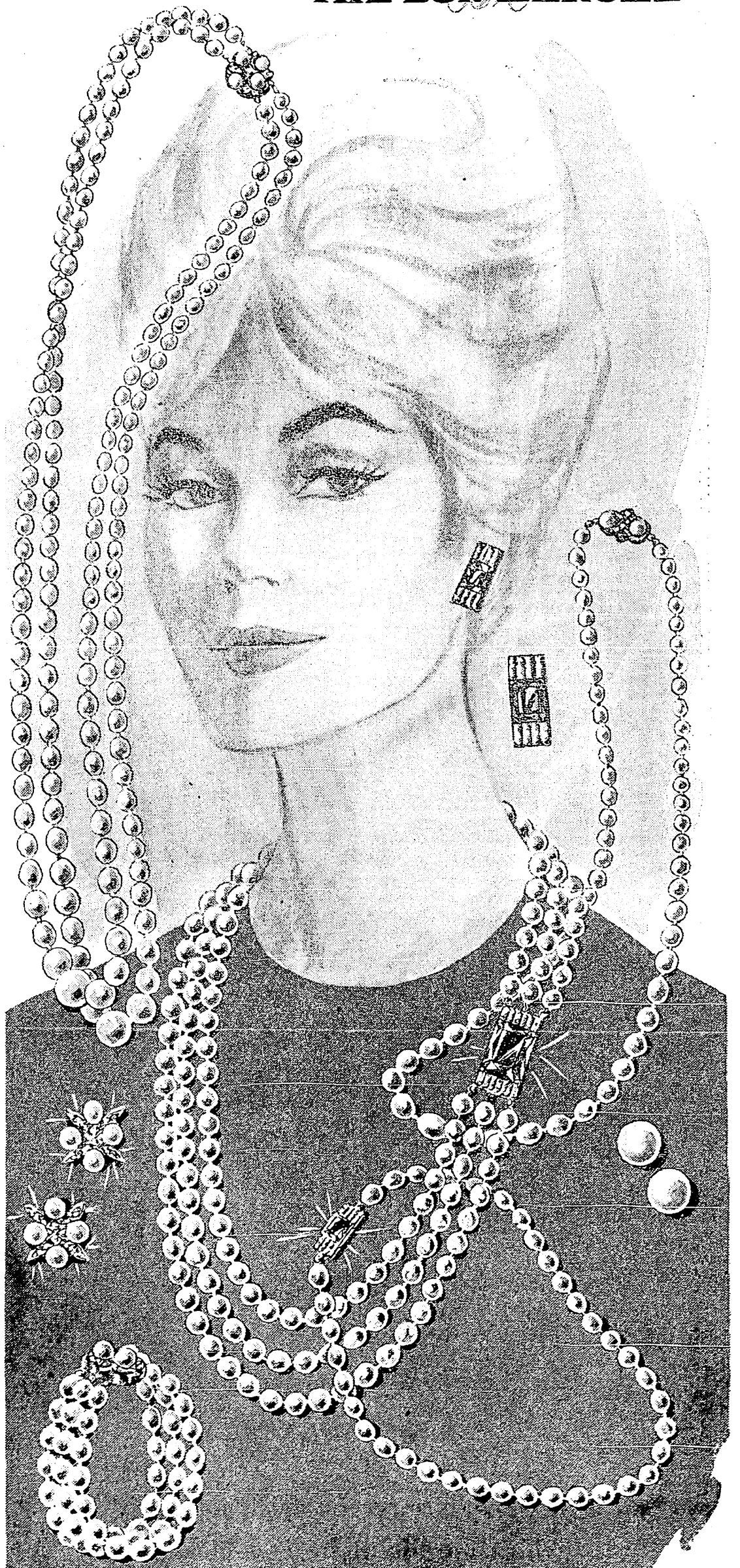
