## 13 Arrested In Probe Of Fake Money

WASHINGTON, May 14 .-(A)-The Secret Service said today it has broken a 14-state counterfeit ring with the arrest of 13 persons and the seizure of bogus bills having a face value of about \$185,-000.

U. F. Baughman, chief of the Secret Service, said John Wesley Riadon, 41, and William Earl Smith, 30, were seized at the Memphis Airport today with \$60,000 in counterfeit currency.

Baughman said Riadon admitted he made the bills near Donelson, Tenn., and that Smith was his principal distributor.

Eleven persons were arrested earlier for passing the bogus bills.
